SELMA TO MONTGOMERY MARCH (1965)

In 1965, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and former UQLWHG 6 W D W H V Representiative Lewis, along with other peaceful civil rights advocates, were violently attacked by Alabama state police in what became known as "Bloody Sunday."

Shortly thereafter, Congress passed the Voting Rights Act of 1965 7 K H 9 R W L Q J Entered sold the sherin Moler of people registered to vote in areas where records of discrimination existed. This Act shifted the power to register voters from state and local levels to the federal level.

NATIONAL VOTER REGISTRATION ACT (1993)

In 1993, the National Voter Registration Act requires state to permit mail-in registration, and to make registration services available at Department of Motor Vehicles, XQHPSOR\PHQW RI"FHV DQG RWKHU

(2020) HISTORICAL VOTER REGISTRATION RATES

In September 2020, the Secretary of State released an updated statewide Report of Registration, showing over 21 million registered voters ahead of the November 3, 2020 General Election.

As of September 4, 2020, 84.68% of eligible voters were registered to vote, the highest percentage heading into a General Election in the past 68 years.
